The Maryland Department of the Environment supports HB 763. This bill will allow greater flexibility for the use of clotheslines in lieu of electric and natural gas driers, and is therefore supportive of the State's climate protection goals. When citizens take steps in their own homes to conserve energy, they are helping the State stay on track to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions 25 percent by 2020, a target mandated by Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Act of 2009. As you know, due to Maryland's extensive coastline, addressing sea level rise and climate change is critically urgent.
