Re: Letter of Support, Senate Bill 63: Transit-Oriented Development- Pledge and Use of Tax Increment Revenues- Operations and Maintenance Funding

Dear Senator Currie and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of the Environment supports SB 63. The bill will allow local governments broader flexibility to use future anticipated increases in tax revenues from land development to fund future operations and maintenance of the developed parcel. In addition, the funds may or may not be used by the local governments in support of funding agreements involving the Maryland Economic Development Corporation, particularly as related to transit-oriented development ventures.

Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) policies support the promotion of transit expansion and increased transit ridership. These TOD policies have positive environmental, health-related, and energy security benefits. They reduce the largest source of vehicle emissions, the vehicle miles traveled (VMT), which results in a reduction of both greenhouse gas emissions and ozone precursor pollutants, thus improving air quality. Reducing VMT leads to less use of petroleum and increased energy independence. TOD policies are an important tool that will help the State achieve its environmental and transportation goals.
