



Proper Handling & Disposal of Tritium EXIT Signs

Are there tritium EXIT signs in *your* buildings?

EXIT signs that contain tritium are potentially hazardous, and need to be handled and disposed of properly to prevent unnecessary radiation exposure. EPA promotes proper disposal of tritium EXIT signs at the end of their useful life and recommends considering non-radioactive alternative technologies when purchasing replacements.

EPA has developed an online training course providing detailed, easy-to-follow guidelines for identifying, using and disposing of tritium EXIT signs. The course discusses the importance of proper use and disposal. This FREE training is ideal: for state and local officials; for owners, managers and maintenance personnel of public places including schools, hotels, malls, dorms and theaters; and for green building designers.
