

**BUCK STEEL DRUM (MD-187)
Baltimore City, Maryland**

Site Location

The site is located in Dundalk, Baltimore City, at 8234 Rosebank Avenue. It consists of two lots, each approximately 100 feet wide by 370 feet. Four run-down and vandalized trailers exist on the property, one of which is a construction field office. The remaining three contain scaffolding racks, rusted empty fuel tanks, empty buckets and scrap lumber. The site owner is Joseph F. Trionfo, a general contractor.

Site History

Originally used as a storage facility for approximately three to four thousand drums of coal tar, the site was cleaned up between late 1979 and early 1980.

Environmental Investigations

A Preliminary Assessment was conducted by the Maryland Waste Management Administration in 1985. The report noted that the site was unkempt, and that the owner was advised to move an improperly stored drum containing antifreeze to an alternative storage area.

Current Status

This site is on the State Master List that identifies potential hazardous waste sites in Maryland. The Master List includes sites currently identified in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Information System. EPA has given the site a designation of No Further Remedial Action Planned (NFRAP). The designation of NFRAP by EPA does not mean that the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) has reached the same conclusion concerning further investigation at the site. The information contained in the fact sheet presents a summary of past investigations and site conditions currently known to MDE.
