Waste Diversion Rate

- ▶ For calendar year 2010, 44% recycling rate + 5% source reduction credit = 49% waste diversion rate.

Residential Program

Curbside

- ▶ The County offers biweekly curbside collection to all single-family households. The program is single-stream, meaning that all materials may be mixed together for collection.
Acceptable items include: mixed paper, newspaper, corrugated cardboard, glass bottles and jars, aluminum and steel cans, and plastic bottles and tubs.

Drop-off

- ▶ The county operates one recycling drop off at its main facilities (9031 Reichs Ford Road) that is open from 7 am to 4:30 pm Monday through Saturday. Items accepted for no charge include all regular single-stream recyclables as well as: scrap metal, large appliances/whitegoods, motor oil, antifreeze, lead-acid batteries, flexible foam, large/bulky rigid plastics (such as plastic play houses or coolers) and yard waste. Items which may be dropped off for recycling at a fee of \$3.80 per hundred pounds of material include: electronics/computers and tires.

Processing/Marketing

- ▶ The County contracts for collection, processing and marketing together. Allied Waste currently has the contract.

Participation

- ▶ Residential participation is voluntary and available to all single-family homes. Three sizes of wheeled recycling carts are offered for use. Visit www.LearnMoreRecycleBetter.org for more info.

Yard Waste

Back yard composting and grasscycling are encouraged. Compost bins are available for sale year round at the Reichs Ford Road facilities.

A grinder is operated at 2 locations in the County, one at Heritage Farm Park in Walkersville and another at the Reichs Ford Road Yard Waste Center, where grass, leaves and brush are accepted free of charge.

- ▶ The county also hosts regional drop off sites for the collection of Christmas trees to be ground for mulch.

Other Programs

- ▶ The County provides space at the landfill for the State Department of Agriculture to hold summer collections for *pesticide bottles*.

- ▶ *Motor oil* is accepted at 9 drop-off sites and antifreeze is accepted at 2 drop-off sites.

Household Hazardous Waste: The County has two residential HHW collection days, held semi-annually in spring and fall. (Contact the County at 301-600-1848 for details.)

Frederick County Public Schools, Frederick Community College and all Frederick County Government offices participate in the county's single-stream recycling program. Local businesses may contract a private hauler to bring recyclables to the County's transfer station at a reduced rate of \$25 per ton (compared to a \$76 per ton tipping fee for municipal solid waste disposal.)

Procurement

- ▶ The County encourages the "Buy Recycled" philosophy and utilizes this philosophy in their purchases when possible.

Public Education & Outreach

- ▶ The Recycling Office is available to make presentations on recycling, back yard composting, waste reduction and general solid waste management programs.
- ▶ The Recycling Education Center at the Reichs Ford Recycling Center provides information about recycling and composting. It also includes a backyard composting demonstration area.
