Board member, Brad Hartman, said he got a call from Art Gilliam from Water Tech wanting to know why Calvert County wouldn't let them get a water conditioning permit. Brad said he has a Master Well Driller and Water Conditioner Installer on staff and that Calvert County told him only a Master Plumber can obtain a permit. Hahns Hairston suggested that Duane Johnson contact Calvert County and let them know that the well driller has a right to obtain a permit. Hahns said Calvert County is not allowed to restrict a license holder from getting a permit.

# • Different State's Examination Qualifications
