RE: Comments on Tentative Determination to Issue Stormwater Permits for Howard and Charles County

Dear Mr. Clevenger:

In 2001, the Maryland legislature, seven counties and the City of Laurel adopted the Patuxent River Policy Plan, which includes goals to restore the water quality and living resources of Maryland's largest and longest river. The Maryland legislature established the Patuxent River Commission to "review the operation of units of State and local government that have responsibility for implementation of the Plan".

At its July 9, 2014 meeting, the Patuxent River Commission received a presentation from Jay Sakai, Director, Water Management Administration, Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), regarding Maryland's NPDES Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit program and processes. In addition, the Commission discussed the benefits and implications of the draft MS4 permits for Howard and Charles County, and inquired about the concerns raised by several environmental organizations concerning Maryland's MS4 permit approach. Several of the Commissioners also shared their concerns regarding the adequacy of the permits to clean up the Patuxent River.

Based on the information provided at its July 9, 2014 meeting, the Patuxent River Commission strongly supports MDE's tentative determination to issue stormwater permits for Howard and Charles County but respectfully requests that MDE ensure that the concerns raised (see attached) by the environmental organizations are meaningfully addressed.
