






























One Park










Watershed 263

Thirteen neighborhoods in West/Southwest Baltimore

- Population of 31,644 people
- Economically challenged communities
- Entirely urbanized: mixed industrial, institutional, and residential land uses
- High levels impervious surface (75%) and low tree canopy (5.9%)
- Dispersed public open space and over 2000 vacant lots
- Large food swamps and food deserts
