Outreach & Restoration Grant Program

Deadline:

Funding Levels:

Once a year, December 5, 2014

Awareness Track: Up to \$15,000 Behavior Change Track: Up to \$50,000 Restoration Track: Up to \$25,000 **Restoration & Outreach: Up to \$75,000**

Eligible Applicants:

Non-profits, public agencies, watershed organizations, schools, etc.









Green Streets, Green Jobs, Green Towns Grant Program

Deadline:

Once a year, March 2015

Funding Level:Up to \$250,000Planning, Design, and Implementation





Watershed Assistance Grant Program – 2yr WIP Milestones

Deadline:

Funding Level:

Once a year, September, 2015 Up to \$70,000 for Planning & Design







Living Shoreline Program

Summer 2015

Funding Level:

Deadline:

Up to \$100,000 (100% for public property, 75% for HOA property, 25% for private property)





Mini Grant Program

Deadline:

Rolling

Funding Levels:

Up to \$5,000

Eligible Applicants:

Non-profits, public agencies, watershed organizations, etc.





Lifecycle of a Grant

- Advertisement/Outreach 3 months
- Grant Application online process with firm deadline!
- Review by Technical Committee
- Awards announced 2 months after deadline
- No reimbursement funding, Signed award letter and contingencies triggers check (large grants phased, but most up front)
- Final Report



Tips and Hints for Success:

- Reach out to Trust program staff early!
- Keep deadlines in mind and apply early for rolling programs!
- Follow the on-line instructions carefully!
- Err on the side of too much information!
- If proposing implementation on a property, have Letters of Support from landowner and other relevant groups/partners!
